

# PROGRAM-TO-PROGRAM ARTICULATION AGREEMENT MT. HOOD COMMUNITY COLLEGE MENTAL HEALTH, SOCIAL SERVICE AND ADDICTION COUNSELING PROGRAM WESTERN OREGON UNIVERSITY GERONTOLOGY PROGRAM

The Parties to this Program-to-Program Articulation Agreement are Mt. Hood Community College (MHCC) and Western Oregon University (WOU).

# **Effective Date:**

This agreement is effective beginning the 2019-2020 academic year, and is subject to bi-annual review by both Institutions for continuation and/or modification.

## **Purpose/Transfer Agreement:**

The purpose of this agreement is to develop, maintain, and promote a smooth academic pathway that supports successful transition to WOU leading to the completion of the Applied Baccalaureate degree in Gerontology. It is agreed that students transferring from MHCC and the Mental Health, Social Service, and Addiction Counseling Program will be given credit for the courses listed below.

This agreement does not guarantee admission to WOU, nor does it carry any other promises, such as financial aid or course placement, unless otherwise noted.

This agreement is based on an evaluation of the rigor and content of the courses at both MHCC and WOU. The courses listed below have been reviewed by WOU faculty and articulated as report below as of May 2019.

MHCC students are required to follow WOU's admissions and application guidelines.

It is recommended that students transferring to WOU obtain an AAS two-year degree from MHCC; specific general education courses will transfer to meet WOU general education requirements.

Students need to complete a minimum of 60 upper division credits at WOU, with a total of 180 credits required to graduate.

### **Terms of Review:**

This agreement is subject to bi-annual review by both Parties for continuation and/or modification not less than ninety (90) days prior to the end of the academic year. This agreement will be updated as courses are added, deleted, modified or re-titled, including changed course numbers. It is the responsibility of the school making the changes to notify the other partner school of the changes so that appropriate updates can be made. Curriculum changes by either WOU or MHCC must be communicated in writing **no later than June 30** of any academic year.

Continuation and/or modification of this agreement must be provided in writing for attachment to the original agreement. Written notice will be given to WOU's Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Gerontology Department Head and Transfer Specialist by Mt. Hood Community College's Dean and approved by Mt. Hood Community College's President, Vice President of Instruction, and WOU's Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences.



#### Miscellaneous:

Admissions to WOU does not guarantee admissions to specific WOU degree programs, which may have additional requirement such as GPA, test score or other criteria. This agreement does not convey any promises, such as financial aid or course placement, unless otherwise noted. Students wishing to enroll at WOU must meet the following admission requirements:

- 1. Meeting all WOU admission criteria (either freshmen or transfer student) prior to enrollment in the student's first WOU course.
- 2. Passing with a grade of C or higher all required community college courses as identified in this agreement.

The courses listed above have been reviewed and approved by WOU faculty for the purposes of this articulation. Students are responsible for notifying the WOU Admissions and Registrar Offices when exercising this agreement to ensure the credits are appropriately transferred. Students must be enrolled at Mt. Hood Community College during the academic year(s) noted in this agreement and must enroll at WOU within one year of the completion of last community college requirement listed in this agreement.

#### **Terms/Termination:**

Amendments to this Agreement may only be in writing and executed by a duly authorized representative of each Party. Amendments are only valid if persons authorized to bind the Party in contract execute them.

This Agreement may be terminated at any time by mutual written agreement. Notice of the Agreements termination must be provided by Mt. Hood Community College to WOU's Dean of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Department Head or Program Coordinator, Division Chair, Provost, Office of the Registrar, and Transfer Specialist.
