To be awarded an AGS degree, students must:

- Complete all requirements to total 90 applicable degree credits.
- Have a minimum GPA of 2.0 in all courses applied to the degree and have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 at the time the degree is awarded.
- Satisfactorily earn 24 credit hours at MHCC. Non-traditional credit (College Level Examination Program, Experience-Based Credit, Challenge, etc.) does not satisfy this requirement.

Please note: Courses may not be repeated for credit unless specified in the course description. Transfer students may need a foreign language to fulfill university admission requirements. Those seeking a Bachelor of Arts degree must complete the second year of a language other than English (201/202/203 or equivalent) before graduating from a public Oregon university.
