Fall 2019 Student Body Diversity of Full-Time Students

MHCC had a total of 2745 full-time undergraduate students in the Fall of 2019.

Of those 2745 students 43% are men and 57% are women.

2018 to 2019 First-to-Second Year Retention Rates for First-Time Students

This retention rate measures the percentage of first-time students who return to MHCC to continue their studies the following fall.

Full-Time: 58%Part-Time: 42%

Graduation and Transfer Rates for First-Time Full-Time Students

The overall graduation rate is also known as the "Student Right to Know" or IPEDS graduation rate. It tracks the progress of students who began their studies as full-time, first-time degree- or certificate-seeking students to see if they complete a degree or other award such as a certificate within 150% of "normal time" for completing the program in which they are enrolled.

MHCC also reports a transfer-out rate, which is the percentage of the full-time, first-time students who transferred to another institution.

Note that not all students at MHCC are tracked for these rates. Students who have already attended another college or university, or who began their studies on a part-time basis, are not tracked for this rate.
